Ephesians 2:10

Being called a piece of work may not be a compliment for some us. If you work everybody's nerves and make excessive demands you may be negatively labeled a piece of work. Not being easy to please or being downright hard work with can make you a piece of work. However, in the text, we are called God's workmanship. **Romans 1:20, Ephesians 2:9** Believers are God's workmanship because we have been created by God. We are His work of art, His masterpiece. **Psalm 19:1, Psalm 33:6** The solar system, moon, and the stars are all a part of God's work. The scriptures give evidence that man and woman are the better of God's creation. He saved the best for last. **Psalm 139** All of us go through periods where we feel as if there is something wrong with us. You need to know that you were custom made. Nobody is like you. You are fearfully and wonderfully made **Psalm 139:14**. We have the personality in line for what God has called us to do. God gives us everything we need.

Genesis 1:27 We were created in God's image and likeness. We represent God. When people see us, they ought to see what God looks like in all of His glory. We not only have a body we have a living soul. We pass by ourselves without wondering; meaning we see nothing special and powerful in ourselves.
